Because Columbus Electric Cooperative operates at cost, we give cash back to our members rather than outside investors or shareholders.

Here's how capital credits work:

Columbus Electric Cooperative members use the electricity we provide and pay their monthly bills, and we track their business with the co-op over time. Columbus Electric Cooperative pays all operating expenses throughout the year, and if any operating revenue is leftover, we allocate it as capital credits. When financial conditions permit, the co-op's board of directors votes to pay capital credits back to the members. Capital credits are just one of the many benefits of co-op membership. Giving back to our local members instead of outside parties is one of the many aspects that set cooperatives apart from other types of businesses.

Our members guide every decision we make and are the reason our co-op exists. To us, you're more than a customer. This holiday season, we hope you're proud to be part of a community-focused co-op that puts people before profits.
